By arrangement with Middleton Arts Management, the Westerlies present a bold and ferociously unique vision of brass, as works originally written for string quartet, solo piano, and the human voice are reinvented through the kaleidoscopic lens of The Westerlies. Works from their latest critically-acclaimed quartet album Wherein Lies the Good are presented alongside a reimagining of Caroline Shaw's landmark string quartet Entr'acte. Imbued with the spirit of improvisation and a folk-like approachability, Wherein Lies the Good presents The Westerlies at their best, cutting new trails across the vast expanse of the American musical landscape. Selections to be announced from the stage. Works to include "Entr'acte" by Caroline Shaw, adaptations of music by the Golden Gate Quartet, music by Duke Ellington, and original compositions by The Westerlies, among others.

The ensemble has produced three critically acclaimed albums of genre-defying chamber music: its 2014 debut, *Wish the Children Would Come On Home: The Music of Wayne Horvitz* (Songlines), a 2016 double-CD of primarily original compositions, *The Westerlies* (Songlines), and a recent 2020 release, *Wherein Lies the Good* (Westerlies Records). Sought-after collaborators, The Westerlies are also featured on recordings by Fleet Foxes (Nonesuch), Vieux Farka Touré (Six Degrees Records), Common (Lakeshore) and Dave Douglas (Greenleaf).

As a 501(c)(3) organization, The Westerlies are on a mission to amplify unheard voices, paint new sonic landscapes, and cultivate a global community. The Westerlies are committed to dismantling racism, sexism, and economic inequality in their field, and aim to reflect their values of diversity and inclusion in the music they make and the spaces they occupy. The ensemble engages students of all ages and abilities around the country with their innovative educational assemblies and masterclasses, promoting the values of cooperation and inclusion through music.
